



**INSPIRATION:**

This highly specialized, non-aromatic herbalist formulation is prepared by hand with organically grown herbs. Unlike typical massage and bath oils made with herbal extracts or aromatic essential oils, Farmaesthetics’ Remedy Oils are infused with whole organic herbs. The herbs we choose undergo a traditional infusion process, allowing time to garner the healing properties inherent in each. The result is significant when used in hot bath soaks and external massage and absorbed through the skin.

**HYSSOP**

Known for its powerful anti-viral properties. Use in the treatment of muscle and neck tightness that is associated with stress, overwork or sore throats due to vocal strain. Revered as “the herb” to ward off viruses or strain that can effect the vocal production of public speakers, politicians, teachers, singers, actors, or anyone trained to use their voice to instruct or perform.

**INGREDIENTS:** sweet almond oil, hyssop\* and vitamin e (certified organic ingredient\*)

Sweet Almond Oil	A light, odorless, high-grade fruit kernel oil - wonderfully nourishing to the skin.
Hyssop	Farmaesthetics uses this herb in its whole herb form (not an extract or essential oil). This is the most therapeutic form of the herb. Hyssop has been used since antiquity. Known as a sacred herb, it is used in purification rituals and rites of passage. In herbalism, it is most noted for its therapeutic effect on the upper respiratory system, with a focus on the throat and vocal chords. Farmaesthetics uses this herbal massage oil as a remedy to sore throat, a tight or constricted feeling in the neck and/or strained vocal chords, due to colds, over-use, tension, or fatigue. Useful oil in massage around the neck and throat area, especially for those who use their voices for public speaking, performing, teaching or singing. .
Vitamin E	Used to stabilize all of Farmaesthetics natural non-aqueous formulations. Benefits in restoring skin’s elasticity. Assists in healing scars and preventing stretch marks in skin that is being stretched from pregnancy or weight gain.
